- Assist running the Lego Club and help to make it a success
- Help staff to set up and clear away play equipment at the start and end of sessions
- Interact with the children, encourage their creativity and recognise their building efforts
- Help come up with new building challenge ideas
- Encourage the children attending this club to borrow library books

Place, period and timetable:

- The minimum commitment we ask for this role is 3 months
- All volunteers are required to undertake a trial period of 2 sessions
- Volunteers will undertake regular review meetings with their volunteer Champion

What we require from you

- A CV and completed volunteering application form (the form will be provided)
- An Identity check will be carried out.
- Two references from referees over 18yrs, who are not family members
